In Flanders fields.



Buddy Poppy

Before Memorial Day in 1922, we (VFW Organization) conducted our first poppy distribution, becoming the first veterans' organization to organize a nationwide distribution. The poppy soon was adopted as the official memorial flower of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, as it remains today.

During our 1923 encampment, we decided that VFW "Buddy"® Poppies would be assembled by disabled and needy veterans who would be paid for their work to provide them with financial assistance. The next year, disabled veterans at the Buddy Poppy factory in Pittsburgh assembled VFW Buddy Poppies. The designation "Buddy Poppy" was adopted at that time.

In February 1924, we registered the name Buddy Poppy with the U.S. Patent Office. A certificate was issued on May 20, 1924, granting our organization all trademark rights in the name of Buddy under the classification of artificial flowers. We've made that trademark a guarantee that all poppies bearing that name and the VFW label are genuine products of the work of disabled and needy veterans. No other organization, firm or individual can legally use the name Buddy Poppy.

Today, our Buddy Poppies are still assembled by disabled and needy veterans in VA Hospitals.

The VFW Buddy Poppy program provides compensation to the veterans who assemble the poppies, provides financial assistance in maintaining state and national veterans' rehabilitation and service programs and partially supports the VFW National Home For Children.

Post Member Spotlight

featuring......Todd Van Sant

Todd Van Sant enlisted in the United States Air Force in the fall of 1991. During MEPS, he was subject to further testing and asked if he wanted to wait a year and go into either crypto or linguistics. Todd chose to turn that option down as he didn't really want to do nothing for a year as he didn't have much going for him at the young age of 18. So he joined without a set classification.

On December 29th, 1991, Todd shipped off to boot camp and spent New Year's in basic training.



Todd spent a few years at Nellis AFB (Las Vegas) where he supported the USAF "Home of the Fighter Pilot". Later, he was shipped to Saudi Arabia (Khobar Towers) to do a 5-month stint supporting the F-4's from the 57th Fighter Wing – this was their last rotation before being shipped off to either the desert to be mothballed, or to be used as drones. Todd referred to these birds as "fuel-to-noise converters", but there are probably many aircraft that carried that designation. He was in theater for the Riyadh bombing, and the Khobar bombing happened just after he left that region.

After leaving Las Vegas, he spent 15 months in Guam where he found the best diving water in the world and spent his days cleaning, servicing and disposing of very old ammunition from WW2. He finished his time in Albuquerque at Kirtland AFB.

Todd left the service 3 days before Y2K as an E-4 (Senior Airman). He was told "you will be called back to active duty if something happens on January 1, 2000". Thankfully the turn of the century was uneventful!

These days Todd spends his days as a general contractor and owns a construction company in the Denver area. Todd lives in Sheridan - moving here in the beginning of 2020, where he joined the VFW and began coming in to Post 9644 in 2021.

Since Todd joined our Post, he has stepped up and helped with getting things repaired (coolers) and other repairs to the Post! He has graciously taken over the VFW website and doing amazing things with that!

Welcome Todd! And thank you for all that you have done, and will do for our Post!
